




Insert an image on the Victorian Short Fiction Project Wiki

Step	Action

Step	Action
2	<p>Upload the file by</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Selecting the image you wish to upload If needed, adding a more descriptive file name in the “Destination filename” field (this will change the name of the file to the name you designate). If desired, adding a description of the file in the Summary field (this is optional, but helpful). <p><i>The site uploads the image and creates a page for the file:</i></p> 
3	Note the name of file, including the extension (in the example, Koala.jpg)
4	Go to the page you where you would like to insert the image and go to the edit view.

Step	Action
